Questions

- 1. What's "new" about the New Testament?
- 2. Each week we're looking at the Bible from a different angle. Today's perspective is that "the Old and New Testaments are like two pieces of a treasure map -neither complete without the other, both presenting the same message from different perspectives, *anticipation* in the Old Testament yielding to *fulfillment* in the New Testament, the Christ of *prophecy* becoming the Christ of *history*." To what extent have you understood the relationship between Old and New Testaments, and what is something that cleared up for you today?
- 3. Have you been a Whole Bible guy or a New Testament guy, and why? Anything said today that will change your approach?

BONUS MATERIAL: Verses from screen about what to do with the Old Testament now that we have the New Testament:

- Jesus came to fulfill not abolish the Law, Matthew 5:17
- The Law and the Prophets no longer proclaimed, Luke 16:16
- No longer under the supervision of the Law, Galatians 3:25
- The Law remains in full force and effect, Luke 16:17
- The Law leads us to Christ to be justified by faith, Galatians 3:24
- Everything in the Law about Jesus must be fulfilled, Luke 24:44:
 - o His Gospel will be preached throughout the whole world and then the end will come, Matthew 24:14
 - o Christ will come again to gather the elect, Matthew 24:27, 30-31, 35, 36-37
