



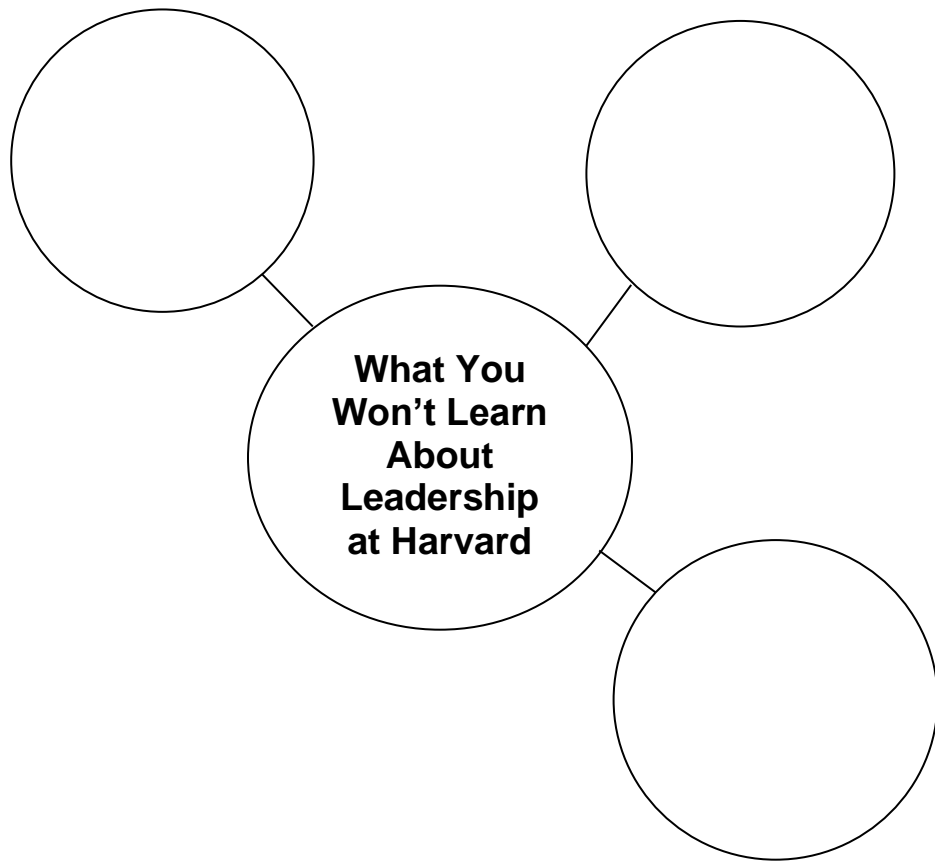

  - Are you becoming tired of depending on God?
  - Are you on a trajectory to finish well or take matters into your own hands?
  - What have you learned today that can strengthen your walk, or help a friend?
  - Do you understand that even though you do "a foolish" thing and there are consequences that God doesn't have a cancel culture?
