


For the Facilitator: A good schedule for a one-hour meeting is 50 minutes for discussion and 10 minutes for prayer. During your meetings, talk about the discussion questions found in that session. It's more important to talk about "real" things your men are dealing with than it is to answer every question. Encourage each man to share his thoughts. You don't have to be an experienced Bible teacher to lead a group. If you don't know the answer to a question, simply say so and move on.







What will you need to get Rewired with Galatians? Only these four things: this booklet, a Bible, a pen, and a notebook to write any extra notes in.



Never done a Bible study before? No problem!

Here's how it works

1. Each week covers a specific passage from Galatians. Be sure to read it first!

4. Here's the Big Idea, the one point that sums up the week.

s. The Talk About It section helps your group discuss the passage and what it means to your every day lives.



2. There's a Key Verse for the week, great if you want to memorize a few verses over the next six weeks!

3. Try This means, well, try it! These are activities to get you thinking.

6. Get Wired is a chance for you to write down a prayer for yourself and plan an Action Step—one thing you will do during the week to let God rewire your heart.

7. On this side, write down the prayer requests of the other guys in your group. You can check back each week to see how they're doing!

Don't Make It So Complicated!

Read: Galatians 1:1-10





I am astonished that you are so quickly deserting the one who called you by the grace of Christ and are turning to a different gospel—which is really no gospel at all.

-Galatians 1:6-7a NIV



Do you have a friend who makes everything more complicated than it needs to be? No matter how simple the task, he can make it a convoluted mess. Sometimes you just want to shake him and say, "Life doesn't have to be this difficult!" Paul is writing the Galatians to shake them up a little. He had visited and taught them about Jesus Christ. He told them that Jesus was focusing on their hearts, not their behavior. That salvation comes from faith, not their own righteousness.

But since he had left, some other teachers had come in, changing the message he had given them, saying: Believing isn't enough (faith)—you have to become Jewish too (works). For them, that included getting circumcised! Ouch!





Paul, an apostle—sent not from men or by man, but by Jesus Christ and God the Father, who raised him from the dead—and all the brothers with me,
